



## In Celebration of Black History Month

Spotlight on the Winston & Merle Roach Camp Leadership Fund Credit: The United Church of Canada



As Toronto United Church Council (TUCC) celebrates Black History Month, we are honoured to spotlight the Winston & Merle Roach Camp Leadership Fund —a legacy of community, leadership, and opportunity for Black youth in United Church camping.

Winston and Merle Roach dedicated their lives to faith and service, shaping the lives of countless individuals within Eastminster United Church and beyond. Whether supporting new immigrants from the Caribbean diaspora, guiding students, or advocating for equity, they were steadfast in their belief that all people deserved access to the same opportunities. Among their many passions, they were longtime supporters of the Camping Opportunities Fund, ensuring that children from all backgrounds could experience the joy and growth that comes from summer camp.

In 2020, their children - Sandra, Donna, Alex, and Martin - established the Winston & Merle Roach Camp Leadership Fund to honour their parents' legacy and to continue their vision.

This fund provides financial support to hire Black youth as staff in United Church camps within the Shining Waters Region, fostering leadership development and representation in a space historically shaped by white communities. For the Roach family, this initiative is deeply personal:

"Our parents worked to address social inequity issues throughout their lives. They believed it was their duty to serve their community and to provide opportunities and access to life experiences available to mainstream society, and to those who would not have had the opportunity otherwise. This, in turn, allows participants to see possibilities for themselves. Having access to life experiences that were previously denied or that were inaccessible, in turn, opens the doors for others to join the 'field' and become part of broader society."

Visiting Camp Scugog in July was an inspirational and emotional experience for Sandra and Donna.

"We were so impressed by the staff's ability to meet the campers where they were. The campers, many of whom were repeat guests, were so grateful to have a respite from their daily lives."

The sisters saw firsthand how the camp functioned like a family, with many campers returning year after year, feeling truly at home.

"The Moms were thrilled with the community they had built with staff support. We were also impressed by the intentionality of camp programming. This intentionality ensures continued diversity of the camp population (staff and campers), contributes to personal growth, provides leadership opportunities, ensures that future projects and activities align with the goals and values of the camp, and encourages campers to participate in all aspects of camp life."

Sandra and Donna also witnessed the impact of their family's fund in action:

"We love that the fund has provided salary funding for Black youth leaders in different areas of camp life—counselors, kitchen staff, media roles, and more. It creates pathways for leadership and inspires campers to see themselves in these roles. We like the fact that the fund provides the opportunity for future Black camp leaders to be paid for their work. And we like that the fund provides the opportunity for campers to return as leaders."

Looking ahead, the Roach family envisions a future where this fund expands to other United Church camps, ensuring Black youth leadership is not limited to a few locations.

"It would be great if the fund could help diversify all TUCC camps, not only Lake Scugog and Camp Big Canoe [who were recipients of grants from the fund in 2024]. The more we highlight the fund and increase its resources, the more camps we can support."

At its heart, this fund is about breaking barriers and creating access. Winston and Merle's legacy lives on in every young leader given a chance to shine, every camper who sees themselves reflected in camp leadership, and every community strengthened by "seeing Canada's diverse population reflected in camp life." Sandra, Donna, Alex and Martin have built a lasting tribute that honours their parents' values and ensures future generations benefit from the same spirit of inclusion, opportunity, and empowerment.


