
Afghan Refugees Update

The Afghan family supported by GFORCE3 has arrived in Georgetown. The father Ghulam Sakhi, 73, is widowed but in good health. He is starting to learn English. Son Farhad, 29, has a 2-year business degree and worked as a customer service rep for a travel company and speaks English well. His association with the pre-Taliban government in Afghanistan made him a target of the Taliban. Daughter Nahida, 26, has a Political Science degree and was teaching computer skills to young girls. Her English is exceptional. She was being actively pursued by the Taliban due to her support of girls' education. Both siblings are now anxious to work.

Another son Fawad is believed safe in Turkey and plans to join the family in Canada in the near future.

These people are over the top in their appreciation for the work of GFORCE3 in arranging for a life in safety and saving them from a life on the run at best, and punishment at the hands of the Taliban at worst.

GFORCE has expended a lot of money over the past two years to keep the family in relative safety in Pakistan pending their approval to come to Canada. They have an obligation to support the family for the next year while they adjust to employment and life in Canada. St. Andrew's board has voted to support GFORCE3 as an outreach initiative. That means we can accept and receipt donations and forward them to GFORCE3. You can mark your gift "Refugees" and every cent will be used for the welfare of these wonderful people.

The 40 Days return Oct. 15-Nov. 26, 2024. Credit: The United Church of Canada




From October 15 to November 26, 2024, the 40 Days of Engagement on Anti-Racism program offers daily and weekly opportunities for learning, reflection, and action.
