

The mitten tree is set up in the Fellowship room and there will be fancy clothes pegs for people to clip on their items as well a box if they would like to donate scarves, hats and socks.



The first architectural drawings of the future 10-bed hospice were recently released (see pictures below). The current Hillcrest UC sanctuary will be preserved and integrated into the hospice complex.


