Exploring Amalgamation Team St Andrews Update:

The Exploring Amalgamation Team at St. Andrews have been busy staffing the various subcommittees to explore the different aspects of church life at both St. John's and St. Andrew's. This month those conversations begin as they review our past and current state. It is important to understand what each congregation is, how they operate and their value system prior to seeing what a merged congregation might look like.

At the Annual General Meeting the suggestion was brought up to change the name from Amalgamation to Collaboration. Collaboration is a very different concept within the church. Our mandate is to explore Amalgamation and present to both congregations what that could look like and ultimately vote if we want to proceed with amalgamating with St. John's. As such we will continue to use the word Amalgamate.

We already collaborate with St. John's on many levels, from joint services to summer coverage and charitable initiatives. While that is not the extent of all available collaboration opportunities, we feel our focus should be on doing the due diligence to explore what amalgamation could look like. As collaboration opportunities present itself the boards of both churches will review and take

avail of the opportunity if it makes sense for both congregations.

We understand that there are very strong opinions about what we should do in the future, we also understand that uncertainty can create some anxiety. Understanding this, we intend to regularly update you in News from the Pews as we progress through this process.

ONCE AGAIN IT IS BROADVIEW MAGAZINE RENEWAL TIME



The winner will declare their choice of Charity from the published list of local charities and the bible study group will present a cheque to the named charity on behalf of St. Andrew's.




This global event brings together people from 170 countries to pray for important world issues. Each year, a different country creates the service materials.

PIE—Public, Intentional, Explicit Inclusion

PIE day reminds us to embody love and celebrate gender and sexual diversity in all its forms.

March 14 is PIE Day, and in church circles it has nothing to do with math. "PIE" is short for "public, intentional, and explicit"—the standards we hold ourselves to when we seek to live into being affirming, welcoming, and inclusive people and communities.

PIE Day was co-founded by Affirm United/S'affirmer Ensemble and Affirming Connections. Every year, Affirm United invites the church to celebrate the full inclusion of 2SLGBTQIA+ people in faith communities and beyond. The day also reminds and challenges us to continue widening our welcome to embody love and celebrate gender and sexual diversity in all its forms. It's critical that we do.

Gender identity and sexual orientation continue to be used to justify serious human rights violations around the world. Same-sex sexual activity is a crime in 71 countries; in 11 of these the death penalty is at least a possibility. Statistics Canada's recently released "data on police-reported hate crimes" and reveals a significant increase in hate crimes targeting individuals based on their sexual orientation. These crimes increased by 69% in 2023, up from 3% in 2020, 70% in 2021 and 16% in 2022. Based on this data, this is an increase of 225% in the past five years (2019–2023).

Your gifts through Mission and Service sustain life-transforming advocacy and

education work, including supporting 2SLGBTQIA+ refugees fleeing for their lives and providing community awareness education, human rights programs, and safe spaces.

This work is vitally important. For some, it means the difference between life and death.




