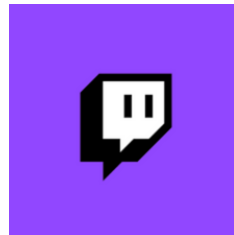

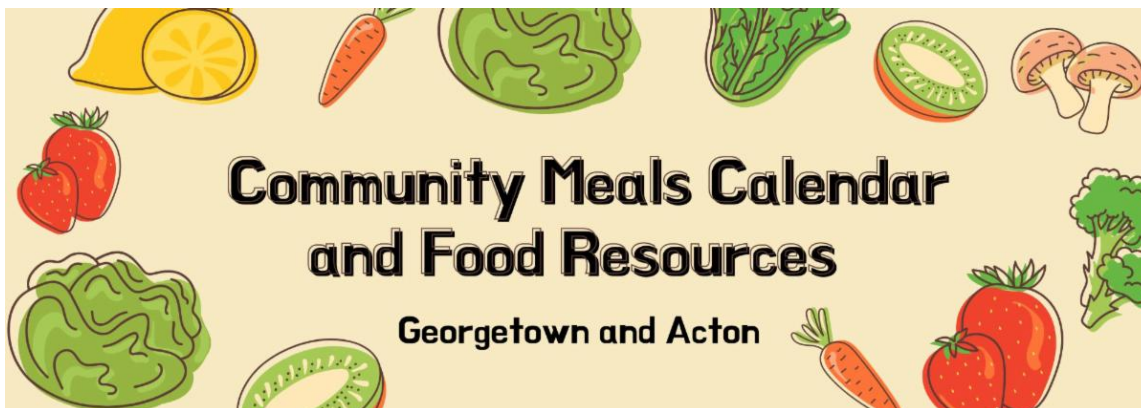


Looking for Volunteers
