#### **Scripture Summary**



#### **A Lenten Study**

Several of us recently participated in Kate's Lenten study Something Sacred: Reflections on music and faith.

The choir has noticed that sometimes we do not see the congregation singing out lustily or with joy when the occasion calls for it.

In the study we were given John Wesley's rules for singing: To paraphrase:

Learn as many tunes as we can as we know the standard ones

- Sing them as they are written without altering them.
- Sing all see that you join the congregation as frequently as you can. Let not weakness or weariness hinder you.
- Sing lustily lift your voice with strength. Be not ashamed of your voice or its being heard. (There is safety in numbers)
- Sing modestly do not bawl as to be above the congregation but strive to unite in harmony to make a melodious sound.
- Sing in time- whatever time is sung be sure to stay with it and stay with leading voices. Do not sing too slow
- Sing spiritually have an eye to God in every word you sing and attend to the sense of what you sing ( sing with joy)

I thought this was interesting and still holds true today. Thank you to Kate for running this study and to all those who participated!






