

Scripture Summary


I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven, and whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven.


When the search for a minister does begin, one of the things that a candidate might consider is what kind of support do we as members bring to this church and its mission.

With the start of the school season, we urge you to consider joining our St. Andrew's Bible Study. As in previous years, we will continue to use the popular Life Guide Bible Study booklets. This season we will be discussing the apostle Paul's personal letters 1 & 2 Timothy and Titus.

While these letters are very short, they provide an immense variety of topics for discussion among the group and for how we should/could live.

We expect that each participant will spend about one hour reading the relevant chapter from the Bible and answering the 12 questions in the booklet. At the meeting, each person has an opportunity to give his or her answer to the question and reflect on what others have said. All answers are warmly received, even including "I don't understand the question" and "This question makes no sense".

We meet in the Fellowship Room, enjoy some tea and coffee, and the occasional goodies. The meeting is over by 11:30 am. The UNITED 4 HOSPICE (U4H) team is made up of volunteers from the four Georgetown Area United Churches who are working together to assist the Townsend Smith Foundation (TSF) with its goal to build North Halton's first hospice residence.

The former site of Hillcrest United Church has been purchased by the TSF and will be the location of the hospice. The hospice will provide 24-hour palliative care for individuals living with a life-limiting illness, support services for the individual's loved ones, and community services. The hospice will offer specialized, individualized care, recognizing that residents are on their final journey and need comfort and kindness. There will be ten private rooms for residents; each will be also be able to accommodate overnight guests. Serene outdoor areas are planned as well as a family/visiting room.

Hamdan wants to become a doctor someday. As the oldest son, this young teenager dreams big amidst the daily struggles that he and his family face. Hamdan's family came to Lebanon several years ago to escape the war in Syria. They can barely afford their monthly rent, food, household expenses, clothing, and medical needs. While his father works in a produce shop, his mother stays at home to care for the family's four children and two other family members. This family of eight lives on the father's pay and a small income supplement they receive from the UN.

Like Hamdan, many children in Lebanon are at risk of losing their education because an economic crisis—intensified by the COVID pandemic and the devastating 2020 explosion in Beirut—has plunged their families into poverty. When parents can't pay school tuition, children face an unstable future. The Middle East Council of Churches (MECC) assists Lebanese students and Syrian refugees ages 8–13 with tuition and fees to secure their education and prevent them from becoming a lost generation.

One thing Hamdan's parents don't have to worry about anymore is his education. With tuition assistance provided by MECC to Hamdan and his siblings, they can continue to study until graduation and gain entrance into a university—giving Hamdan a chance to achieve his dream.


